WHEREAS, Barcelona Harbor, Dunkirk Harbor and Cattaraugus Creek Harbors are invaluable cultural and economic assets to Chautauqua County and to the Town of Westfield, City of Dunkirk and the Town of Hanover, and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) has the primary responsibility for the operation and maintenance of these harbors and has deferred authorized maintenance activities, including dredging and breakwater repairs due to limited Federal funding for harbors with limited commercial navigation; and

WHEREAS, an economic impact analysis of the three harbors would support Chautauqua County's continuing effort to advocate for Federal funding for the authorized operation and maintenance of the harbors, support future applications for State and local funding opportunities for economic development and encourage new private investment in our harbors and waterfronts: and

WHEREAS, the Chautauqua County Department of Planning and Economic Development desires to partner with the Town of Westfield, City of Dunkirk and the Town of Hanover and the Norther Chautauqua County Community Foundation's Local Economic Development Committee (LED) to apply for \$35,000 in grant funding from the New York State Department of State (NYSDOS) Division of Planning Local Waterfront Revitalization Program to retain a consultant to determine the true economic impact of the three harbors by advancing an Economic Impact Analysis; and
